
## President's Message

## **Negotiations Update**

Things were very slow and non productive at the local negotiation table. Although, things have happened since we gave our 5 days notice to the board. Yes, we're on strike in the form of limited withdrawal of services in the form of sanctions, but some good has come out of the sanctions. Since that notice, the board has given us a full two further negotiation dates on December 9th and 10th. We are

very hopeful to be able to negotiate a fair settlement. That being said, if the Board cannot see our priorities and recognize the need for fulsome discussion and improvements to some of our language then it's possible there could be escalation of action. In addition to the board giving us further negotiation dates, parents and coworkers have lent their support to our cause. Parents have been

handing out flyers to other parents outside our elementary schools to educate them about our job action and the importance of a deal. I also believe that the board is getting a more clear picture of how vital we all are to the whole school team and to our students. Keep up the great work. As always we will endeavor to keep you well informed throughout the entire process.

## Where is that form hiding???

With the switchover to the new email and web platforms for the UGDSB, we've had some challenges in finding forms. They aren't really hiding, but they are definitely not as easy to find as on the previous platform. Here is an easy way to locate them:

SAFE SCHOOL REPORTS— Log into UGCLOUD. Input your username and password. Click on UGShare. Go to Links. Click on Safe School Report. Fill it in. Click and send.

For any other Health and Safety forms like Employee Incident and Accident forms and Violent Incident Forms—Log into outlook/windows. Input your username and password. Click on UGShare. Go to Health and Safety Forms. Find the form you are looking for. Click on that form. These

forms are electronic and you can fill it out online; but you can also print them out and fill them in manually. The form tells you where to send it. If you have difficulty accessing these forms, please email Julie Wagner @ jcw@wightman.ca and she will bring the inaccessibility issues to the Joint Board and Union Health and Safety Committee, where Julie sits as our representative.
